## ORDINANCE FOR SANITARY DISPOSAL OF REFUSE.

## SECTION I. Definitions.

(a) Refuse - The term "refuse" shall include garbage, rubbish, ashes and non-putrescible wastes from all public and private establishments and residences.

(b) Garbage - The term "garbage" shall include all waste accumulation of animal, fruit or vegetable matter, used or intended for food, or that results from the cooking, dealing in, or storing of animal, fruit or vegetable matter, and, shall include all other putrescible waste.

(c) Rubbish - The term "rubbish" shall include all non-putrescible waste, except ashes.

(d) Ashes - The term "ashes" shall include the waste products of coal and other fuels.

(e) Industrial by-Products - The term "industrial by-products" shall mean any waste by-product of any industrial or manufacturing process.

## SECTION II.

No person shall deposit any refuse on any public street, highway, or alley-way, or, on any railroad right-of-way in the City of Pinconning.

## SECTION III.

No person shall deposit any refuse upon private property,

whether owned by such person or not within the corporate limits of the City of Pinconning, except under the following conditions:

- (a) That all garbage be kept in a separate and covered container. Such container shall be constructed in such manner as to be strong, not easily corrodible, rodent proof and insect proof. Such container shall be removed and emptied once every two weeks. This subdivision (a) shall not apply to any person, who disposes of garbage by immediate incineration, or, by a sanitary sewage connected disposal.
- (b) That all other refuse, except garbage, shall be kept in a separate container. Easily flammable refuse, except garbage, may be placed in a separate container and burned on the premises if such burning can be accomplished without danger to persons or property.

#### SECTION IV.

No person shall deposit any refuse on any lands owned or controlled by the City of Pinconning except in such places and at such times as shall be designated by the City Council.

#### SECTION V.

No person shall deposit automobile bodies or industrial by-products on any lands owned or controlled by the City of Pinconning.

## SECTION VI.

Any person who violates any of the foregoing provisions of this ordinance, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county Municipal jail for a period of not more than 90 days or a fine of not more than \$100.00, or both by such fine and imprisonment.

## SECTION VII.

This ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after July 1, 1956.

AN ORDINANCE TO PREVENT THE SALE OF UNWHOLESOME  
PROVISIONS AND IMPURE MILK.

SECTION 1. The Village of Pinconning ordains; That no person shall within the limits of the Village of Pinconning, sell any corrupt, unwholesome or diseased meat, fish, fruit, poultry, vegetables or provisions of any kind.

SECTION 2. No person shall, knowingly, sell to any person or persons in said Village any milk adulterated with water, or in any way adulterated, nor shall any person knowingly sell milk the product of a sick or diseased animal, or any milk produced by a cow fed on the refuse of a distillery or of a brewery, or upon any substance detiterious to the quality of the milk.

SECTION 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars and costs of prosecution, and imprisonment in the Bay County Jail for a term not exceeding sixty days, and in the imposition of any fine and costs the Court may sentence the offender to imprisonment in the Bay County Jail until the payment thereof for a term not to exceed Sixty days.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance is ordered to take effect from and after the 14th day of November 1887.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE MILK SUPPLY OF THE CITY OF PINCONNING; TO PROTECT THE HEALTH OF THE CITIZENS OF THE CITY OF PINCONNING; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUING OF LICENSES THEREUNDER AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF; TO REPEAL ANY AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT OR CONTRADICTORY THERETO;"

THE CITY OF PINCONNING ORDAINS:

SECTION 1.

Sections 2, 3, 4 and 12 of an ORDINANCE entitled, "AN ORDINANCE to regulate the milk supply of the City of Pinconning; to protect the Health of the Citizens of the City of Pinconning; to provide for the issuing of licenses thereunder and penalties for the violation of the provisions thereof; to repeal any and all other ordinances inconsistent or contradictory thereto," are hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2.

No person shall engage in the production, delivery, distribution or giving away or sale of milk and/or cream for direct consumption within the City of Pinconning without first obtaining a license therefor as provided by this ordinance. No license shall hereafter be granted to any person, firm or corporation operating a pasteurizing plant which plant is located outside of the corporate limits of the City of Pinconning.

## SECTION 3.

Every person required to obtain a license by this ordinance shall first secure a permit from the Health Officer or his representative and shall pay therefor to the City Treasurer the following fees:

- (a) For each pasteurizing plant, \$25.00 for the first twenty-five (25) or less producers from whom milk is purchased and \$25.00 for each additional twenty-five (25) producers or fraction thereof.
- (b) \$10.00 for each delivery truck owned, leased or controlled by the owner or operator of such pasteurizing plant.
- (c) \$5.00 for each vehicle delivering milk to the pasteurizing plant.

Each person so licensed, before engaging in the sale of milk and/or cream or the delivering thereof, shall cause his name and license to be legibly and conspicuously posted in his place of business and on each outer side of all vehicles, (in figures not less than three inches in height) used by him in the conveyance of milk and/or cream. Licenses issued under this ordinance shall not be transferable.

## SECTION 4.

Every license issued hereunder shall expire March 1 following date of issue, unless sooner revoked.



**SECTION 12.**

No person shall sell, expose, give away, or offer for sale milk or cream, except it be in closed bottles, or in cans not less than three gallons capacity. These bottles and cans must be filled only at a licensed milk plant or dairy within the city limits of the City of Pinconning.

**SECTION 2.**

This amending ordinance is declared severable and if any section or part of a section shall be held unconstitutional, the validity of the balance of the ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

**SECTION 3.**

This ordinance shall become effective February 21st, 1949, and shall be published February 9, 1949.
