## 12.NEW BUSINESS:

A. Resolution #2024-06- Adoption of the annual exemption option as set forth in 2011 Public Act 152, the publicly funded health insurance contribution act

This is an annual resolution regarding the exemption option of health care expenses for the municipality. The City Council chose to choose option number 2 which states the city pays 80% of health care costs and the employee pays 20% of the premiums. A motion was made by Chant, seconded by Kuehne to approve Resolution #2024-06 as presented. Roll call taken: Chant, Johnson, Kuehne, Wiess, Boetefuer, Mayor Boettcher YES Lesniak NO, motion carried.

## B. Approval of language change for storage of fire apparatus per the Fire Board Agreement

This addition to the agenda was presented by a member of the Fire Board regarding a change of language in the Fire Board Agreement. A few minor changes to the wording of locations of storage for the trucks were noted and will be voted on by all of the participating entity boards and will be completed and approved as a whole at the July 25 Fire Board meeting. A motion was made by Wiess, seconded by Lesniak to approve the language change as requested. All yeas, motion carried.

Council Member Wiess commented on the email that the City Manager issued today regarding her conversation with Larry Trudell from Larry's Corner Lounge. He had concerns with the Block Party events, the beer tent and the selling of land from last year.
