1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER:

4. MAYOR'S COMMENT:

Treasurer Bromberg indicated everyone received a Revenue and Expenditure report and also explained the large amount of the budget adjustment from the water as a result of the water rate study and the mistakes made due to wrong figures. Bromberg also stated the last day for collecting taxes without penalties is February 17 and can pay in our office until March 2 before the taxes are turned over to the county.

City Manager Lakin stated she was present at the DDA meeting and discussion was held regarding the sewer project that the city proposed to the DDA. This project consists of a forced main that would benefit the business district. They also discussed the issues regarding the zoning map and DDA capture properties. Both of these items were tabled to the next meeting.

Council Member Piechowiak reported on the meeting of the Fire Board earlier this month. He discussed the wonderful news of the fully paid new Firetruck and how funds for this came through the hard work of Chief Ramsay and contributions from the tribe.

Council Member Bleshenski indicated the Planning Commission has a meeting on January 28 at 5:00pm.


